

## **COMPOSITION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD, SUPERVISORY COMMITTEE AND GENERAL MEETING**

### **Members of the Alliance Ukraine GOVERNING BOARD**

Dr Yuriy Kobyshcha, Board Chairman

Dr Yuriy Kobyshcha is a known Ukrainian epidemiologist with a long and distinguished career. He played a significant role in shaping the Ukrainian response to the HIV epidemic and is one of the most respected experts in the AIDS arena in Ukraine and the region. He is one of the pioneers of AIDS prevention programs, particularly serving as a National Coordinator for the pilot projects on HIV/AIDS prevention among most at risk groups (IDU, FSW) in Southern and Eastern Regions of Ukraine in 1995-1997. He has substantial experience of working with the governmental institutions, particularly serving as First Deputy Chairman of the Presidential National AIDS Committee (later transformed into National Committee on Drug Abuse and AIDS Prevention). Dr Kobyshcha was one of the initiators and founders of the State Ukrainian Centre of prevention and counteracting AIDS. He has extensive experience of working with UN agencies, particularly with WHO, UNDP, UNAIDS, both in Ukraine and abroad, particularly in Vienna and Geneva. Since February 2005 he has been working for WHO in Ukraine focusing on monitoring and evaluation of the health sector response to HIV/AIDS epidemic, strategic Information system and operational research. He holds PhD (Scientific Degree of Candidate of Medical Science) in Public Health (1985). Author and co-author of 118 publications.

Svetlana Antonyak

A pioneer of AIDS treatment in Ukraine, Svetlana is the Head of the HIV/AIDS clinical department of the Gromashevsky institute of Epidemiology and Infectious Diseases of the Ukrainian Academy of Medical Sciences. She has a long track record as the lead adviser for Alliance Ukraine on treatment, procurement and supply issues, and also consults to the Ukrainian PLHA Network, WHO, UN and other stakeholders. She played a leading role in the introduction and scale-up of AIDS treatment in Ukraine, took an important part in the development of training and preceptorship systems for AIDS clinicians in Ukraine and other countries of the region. Svetlana also supported the creation of the first civil society organisations representing and protecting interests of HIV positive people in Ukraine. As a trainer and resource person Svetlana is also involved in the current efforts to introduce AIDS treatment, develop non-clinical care and support services, and strengthen PLHA movements in other countries of the former Soviet Union. In addition, Svetlana is the author of some 85 scientific works on the issues of HIV/AIDS clinics and treatment.

Iryna Borushek

One of the first Ukrainian PLHA activists and a founder of the Ukrainian PLHA Network. Iryna is a member of the National AIDS Coordination Council, delegation member in Eastern Europe of Global Fund to fight AIDS, TB and Malaria Board. For a number of years I. Borushek led the Alliance Ukraine Treatment, Care and Support Department and later worked as Senior Adviser on PLHA issues. Iryna played significant advocacy role in the development of Ukrainian response to HIV epidemic. She participated in the Ukrainian delegation to UNGASS, where the officials worked for the first time alongside with HIV-positive people, and has been instrumental in the positive changes of the government's position on AIDS. She received a Red Ribbon Award in recognition of leadership, partnership and dedication to the response to AIDS in Ukraine from UN HQ, New York, and Award for Women's Leadership on HIV and AIDS from World YWCA an International Women's Summit (Policy and Advocacy nomination).

#### Roman Kobets

Dr Roman Kobets is widely known and respected in Ukraine as a policy analyst and media activist. He has a special interest in issues of governance and fighting corruption - and especially in the role of the media in ensuring understanding and support for reforms. His recent work has included addressing a media backlash against immunisation and the introduction of an schools exam system that is not open to corruption, serving since February 2008 as Head of the Information Centre for Independent Testing. He has extensive experience of working with governmental and nongovernmental organizations, donor agencies, educational and research institutions. He also has wide experience of working with the Parliament, particularly being a consultant of the Committee of the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine on State Building and Local Self-government. He holds PhD from Ukrainian Academy of Science (1996), author of and numerous publications.

#### Anya Sarang

Founding member and Programme Director of the Russian Harm Reduction Network, one of the principle recipients of the Global Fund funding in the Russian Federation. Anya is a well known Russian harm reduction activist with large experience in community based programming, community mobilisation, advocacy and other areas. She has worked on HIV/AIDS in the Russian Federation and other Former Soviet Union countries since 1997. She has very essential experience in the region, particularly being a head Central and Eastern European Harm Reduction Network in 2003-2006, as well as internationally, particularly in the research field at the Centre for Research on Drugs and Health Behaviour, Imperial College, UK.

#### Andrey Kryvokorytov

#### Jon Cooper, Head of the Committee
