# MOBILE TREATMENT POINTS (MTP)

MTP is an effective mechanism for providing medical services to people living in territories where there is no or non-working/ destroyed/damaged health care infrastructure and/or there is no access to medical services, doctors and medicines (including through the system «Available drugs» that are provided by the state) as a result of a full-scale invasion.





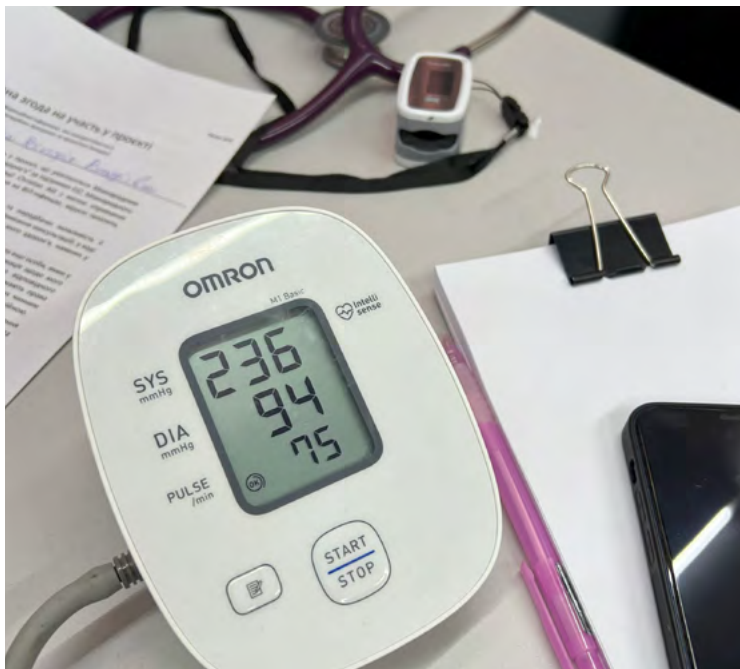
Each MTP team uses three mobile vans - tough road-capable large cargo vans (with dual rear wheels and additional equipment for on-road emergency). All vans are re-equipped in mobile clinics that have autonomous heating and AC, autonomous long-lasting electrical supply, have water sink and fridge. The clinics have two separated fully equipped rooms with separate entrances to serve two flows of patients.



# 1. Primary health care

The first clinic is used for routine check-ups and counseling by primary health doctors and provision of essential medicine.





## 2. Mobile diagnostic

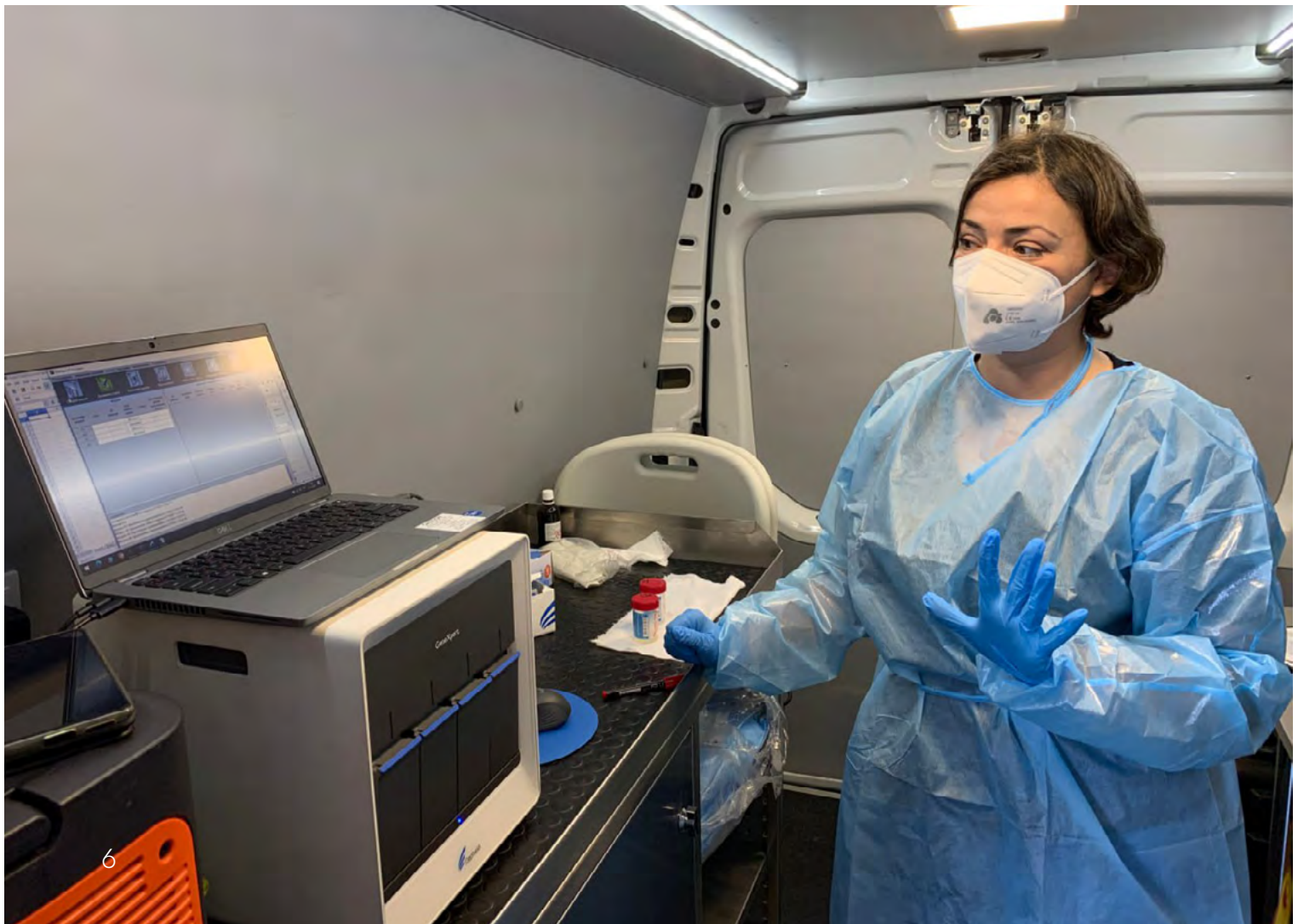
The second one is equipped with an examination couch and hematology analyser, portable ultrasound, and basic medical diagnostics including cardiograph, glucometer, tonometer.





### 3. Integrated services on TB, HIV, HCV, HBV, Syphilis

The third van is used for screening for HIV, HCV, HBV, Syphilis with rapid tests, TB screening and diagnostics with GeneXpert and ultra-portable x-ray in partnership with local TB clinics. Linkage to treatment with case management support from local civil society partner organizations.





MTP team works every second week for six days, two days for arrival and departure to the base location, one day for preparation and three full days in the field operations. In general, during one day, one team can examine and dispense medicine to an average of 70 people. The team also distributes about 150-200 home first-aid kits (one for family).

# MTP CONTRIBUTES TO RESILIENT HEALTH CARE SYSTEMS IN THE WAR AFFECTED REGIONS AND CLOSE TO FRONTLINES

The MTP works closely with local authorities, military administrations and Departments of Health to identify the locations and communities most in need of medical and humanitarian services, assess the needs for the particular visit and to avoid duplication of efforts by partners, as well as to ensure the safety of MTP project personnel. Priority is given to communities where there is no availability or complicated access to medical care, no functioning health system infrastructure, no medical personnel, no pharmacies.

# MAIN RESULTS

## Kharkiv region

Since December 2022, the team has made **85 trips** to **66 settlements** in the Kharkiv region.



**During this time we managed to:**



Family doctors provided consultation and dispensed the necessary medicines to **4,000 people**;



**6,570 families** received an individual home first-aid kit with basic medicines;



**400 people** for the first time in the last year had a cardiogram and **529 measured** their blood glucose level;



**200 people** had a general blood test;



**228 people** were tested for HIV (screened positive - 1);



**227 people** were tested for Hepatitis C (screened positive - 5).





# Kherson region

Since April 2023, the team has made **60 trips** to **48 settlements** in the Kherson region, including Kherson city.





**During this time we managed to:**



Family doctors provided consultation and dispensed the necessary medicines to **almost 3,650 people**;



**More than 5,100 families** received an individual home first-aid kit with basic medicines;



**About 950 people** for the first time in the last year had a cardiogram and **600 people** measured their blood glucose level;



**190 people** were tested for HIV (screened positive - 3);



**190 people** were tested for Hepatitis C (screened positive - 8).

# Zaporizhzhia region

Since May 2023, the team has made **46 trips** to **38 settlements** in the Zaporizhzhia region.

During this time we managed to:



Family doctors provided consultation and dispensed the necessary medicines to **more than 2,120 people**;



**More than 2,400 families** received an individual home first-aid kit with basic medicines;



**Almost 800 people** for the first time in the last year had a cardiogram and **732 people** measured their blood glucose level;



**314 people** were tested for HIV (screened positive - 5);



**303 people** were tested for Hepatitis C (screened positive - 13);



Phthisiatricians provided consultation to **almost 370 people**;



**55 people** were tested for TB using GeneXpert

# Donetsk region

Since November 2023, the team has made **11 trips** to **8 settlements** in the Donetsk region.

**40 families** received an individual home first-aid kit with basic medicines;



**Almost 90 people** for the first time in the last year had a cardiogram and 105 measured their blood glucose level;



**Almost 200 people** had a general blood test;



**32 people** were tested for HIV;



**32 people** were tested for Hepatitis C (screened positive - 2);



**22 people** were tested for TB using GeneXpert

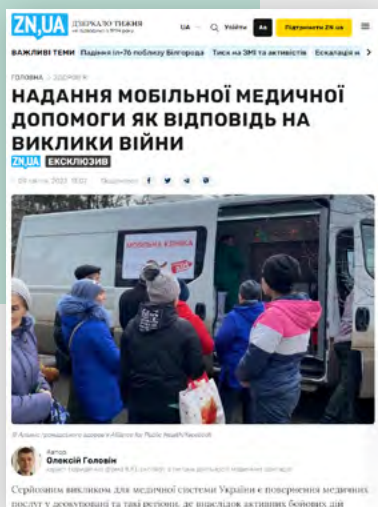

Always waiting!

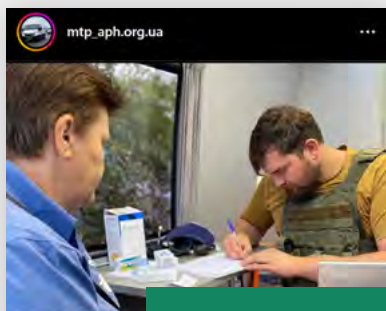

Many of them don't even remember what it's like to live a peaceful life and not to flinch at loud sounds. And although we adults cannot take the war out of their lives, we can give them at least warm moments of carefree childhood. On every visit of the MTP project, we carry toys and books for the youngest patients.

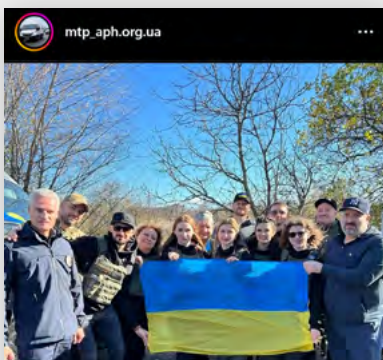
We have our own offensive. Our mobile clinics are constantly moving through Ukrainian territories, including places where doctors have not arrived since February last year. Now we are taking the Zaporizhzhia region under our wing.

Deoccupied, but under everyday shelling Kherson region. This area is called the «red zone» - life here is cut to pieces between intervals of rocket attacks. [...] They are strong, but their hearts need a doctor's help. In the Kherson region, people often asks our doctors to perform a cardiogram and check the condition of the heart. [...] But all these risks are worth the results of our work. Worth hearing from people that they are waiting for us again. Because, they say, they did not receive such attention from local doctors as from our doctors, and often such a level of medical care. Even in hospitals of district or regional centers.

Donetsk region was disfigured by the war. There is a great need for medical help. People are exhausted by the fighting that has not subsided for years, their health is often in critical condition. Elderly people and people with disabilities have already lost hope that they will receive medical care that will alleviate their suffering. High blood pressure, which sometimes reaches 230 to 130, heart problems, high sugar levels - all this is usually the background for such serious diseases as oncology, psoriasis and others.
